# Rector's Update

Greetings to the saints at St. Paul's,

The summer heat makes it easier to stay home, and that makes worshipping online a little easier to take. We heard a lot of good points made about protecting physical health by physical distancing, and I appreciate the intent. I'd also propose that we need to consider other aspects of our health. Physical health via exercise, sleep, and proper diet remain as important today as ever. Likewise, our mental health needs attention through social contact. Social media has its place, and so does making telephone calls to family and friends. Those who wait for someone else to call them may wait a long time. I am concerned about all those areas, and as the Rector, I'm also concerned about the spiritual well-being of parishioners. St. Bonaventure said, 'In the way of virtue, there is no standing still; anyone who does not daily advance, loses ground. To remain at a standstill is impossible; one who gains not, loses; one who ascends not, descends. If one does not ascend the ladder, one must descend; if one does not conquer, one will be conquered.' While we're in a time of not meeting physically, we have other ways to grow in our walk with Jesus. St. Paul's offers interactive Noonday Prayer on Wednesday, and a Friday morning Bible study.
